


































































Excellence in All India Secondary School (Class X) Exams 2014

The exhibition laid a strong emphasis on Indo-Oman Relations. It was in a way

Modern Indian Authors' section included Hindi poets and other literary charisma of contemporary India. Department of Mathematics characteristically magnetised the audience with their presents given the title of Ancient Numerals, Math-World, Math and Monuments, Mathemagic, Math – Infinite World, Contribution of Mathematicians, History of Mathematics and Origami, Properties of

Triangles and Circles, Vartik – the Abacus and Medieval Abacus, and so forth. The ambience was like going on a cruise by Herbert George Wells 'Time Machine'. Other substantial showpieces were Agriculture and Trade, Hydroelectric Project and Rainwater Harvesting, Amazing Staircase and Probability Game, Days like Dreams, Adfinity, Jog Waterfall, Kids' Gallery, Origami Steamer and Origami Jungle, Auto-cleaner Water Level Indicator, Model Sugar Industry, and the like.

Department of Arabic came forward with a list of Arabic-Speaking Countries and their Capitals, International Vocabulary Originated from Arabic, Contribution of Arabic to Philosophy, and the like. Their Malayalam counterpart pictured their Culture and Literature.

Department of Science brought Wireless and Internet, Metallurgy and its Applications, Microscope – Hook's Model, Ancient Instruments, Astronomical Changes,

Contribution of Ancient Science, Time Devices, Ancient Monuments in Science, Wonders of Science, Ebola, Magic of Science, Curious Science Facts, and the like.
