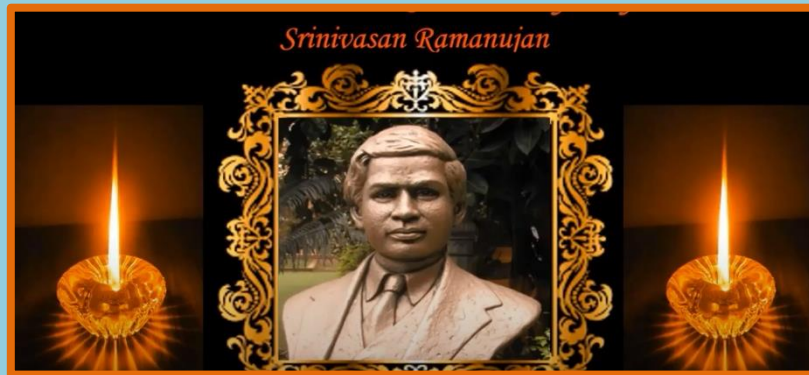

This day marks the birth anniversary of self-taught Indian mathematician Sri Srinivasa Ramanujan and his contribution in the field of mathematics. In order to pay tribute to his achievements, the former Prime Minister of India Dr. Manmohan Singh on February 26, 2012 declared his birthday as National Mathematics Day. 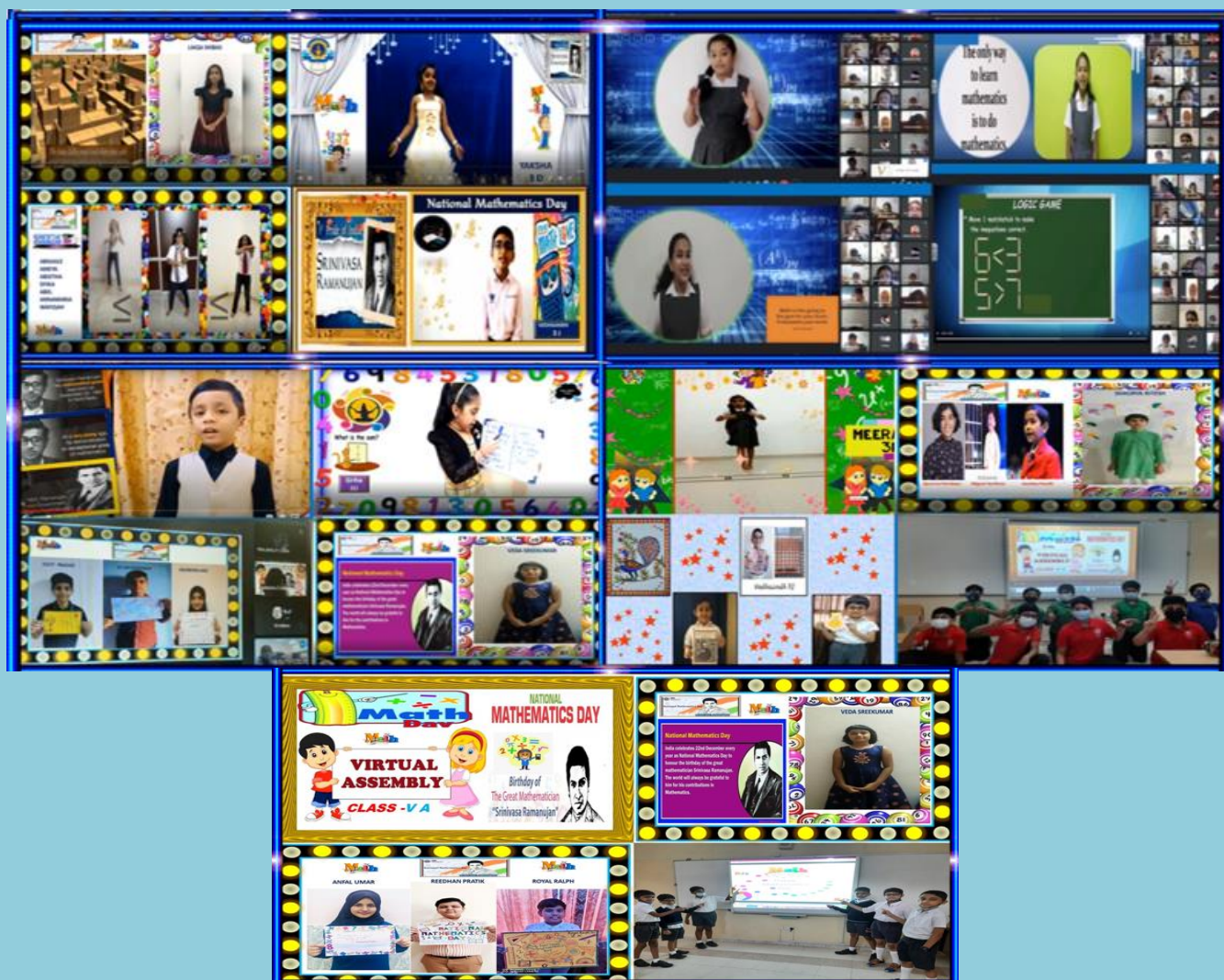
