


MON AVIS







Head Boy's Message

Key Highlights during the Year


1. Career Fairs and University Visits


CBSE – Project Veer Gatha



ECO CLUB ACTIVITIES

"Swachhata Pakhwada" is a CBSE-initiated program. The awards and recognitions earned by ISWK demonstrate the school's continuous efforts in fostering environmental consciousness and academic excellence. These achievements further

Gavel Clubs activities -

The Gavel Clubs at ISWK were established in 2014, chartering two clubs in the first year. Over the years, these clubs have grown and flourished. As of 2020, we have six Gavel Clubs with 160 students training and benefiting from Toastmasters International's systematic programs. The aim of the Gavel Club is to develop better communicators and leaders through public speaking and leadership programs. These clubs have been facilitated by a team of ISWK Toastmasters since 2016.

Teachers from the English Department, along with a few teachers from other departments, continuously train students to enhance their public speaking skills. Each year, the best speakers from each club are selected to represent our school in the Oman Gavel Championship of Public Speaking.

The Oman Gavel Championship of Public Speaking 2025 showcased exceptional oratory talent from young speakers across the Sultanate. The event, held at Indian School Bousher, featured participants from various Gavel Clubs competing in multiple categories. Notably, the championship included segments such as Humorous Speech, Evaluation Speech, Table Topics Speech, and International Speech.

The Oman Gavel Championship of Public Speaking 2025, organized by Oman Gavel Clubs (OGC), took place on February 1, 2025. This annual event provides a platform for young speakers aged 12 to 18 to showcase their public speaking talents. The competition progresses from club-level contests to group-level events, culminating at the Sultanate level.

In the lead-up to the championship, various preparatory events were organized to enhance participants' skills. The semi-final was held on January 31, 2025, featuring young speakers competing to represent their clubs. There were 260 semi-finalists from 33 clubs across the Sultanate, out of which only 32 students moved to the final round. 






6. STAI 2024 – Science, Technology and Innovation
