Master Tej Prashant Nilkund has topped the list of successful candidates with a stupendous performance with 97.8%. Following him is Ms. Sayanti Maiti in the second place with an aggregate of 97.4 % and Master Vaisnav Rajesh Nair (96.8 %) in the third place.

The total number of students appeared in the board exams from ISWK for the academic year 2018-2019 were 359. Out of 359 students, 82 students have secured more than 90% in all subjects. ISWK has once again proven their mettle by securing a school average of more than 79% in all the subjects.




INTER-SCHOOL FRENCH EVENT


