Cawky

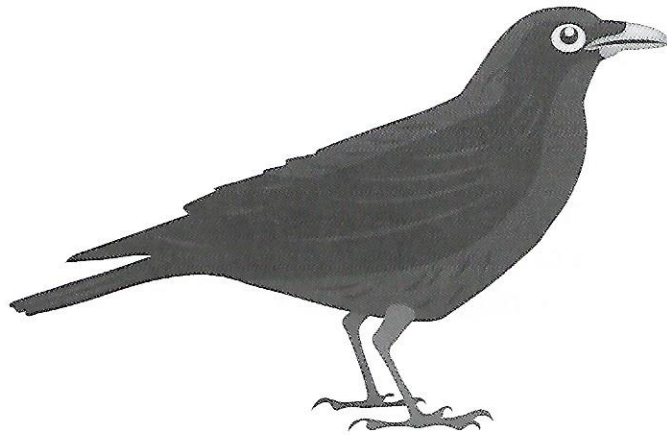
My best friend is a big, black crow. He is the type of bird that farmers, amazingly, want to scare away.

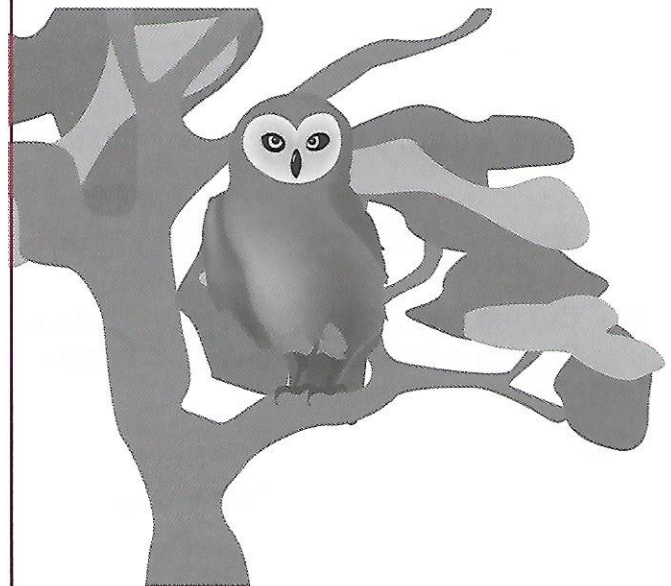

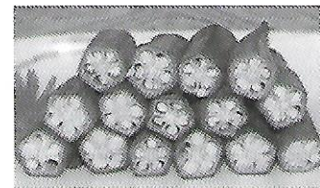
Vegetable Art

How to create a flower using vegetables and paints

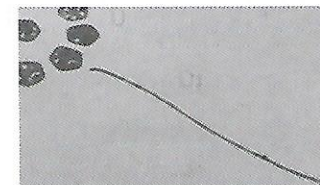
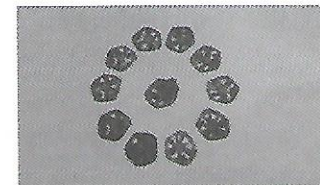
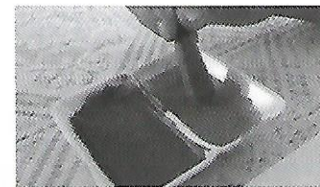
You will need

- red and green paints
- paper
- 2 dishes
- a few okra (cut in half as shown)
- a few green bean pods (cut on an angle)
- a kitchen sponge
- a green marker pen

Okra cut in half



- 1 Spread out the sheet of paper.
- 2 Put a spoon of each paint colour into a separate dish.
- 3 Dip the cut edge of the okra into the red paint. If the paint is dripping, gently wipe the okra on the sponge.
- 4 Press the okra onto the paper. Repeat this many times, making a circular pattern. You will start to see the petals of a flower.
- 5 Draw a stem using the green marker below the flower.
- 6 Cut the bean on an angle and dip it into the green paint. Press the bean onto the paper to make the leaves.
