- Left quietly after the cremation a powerful symbol of loss.

c. Value Points:

- Wry smile = a sad but accepting response to loss.
- Mother smiled remembering her lost childhood (beach memory).
- Poet smiles sadly remembering her late mother.
- "Laboured ease" shows grief is hard to bear but becomes familiar with time.
