30. The study of the conductivity of electrolyte solutions is important for the development of electrochemical devices, for the characterisation of the dissociation equilibrium of weak electrolytes, and for the fundamental understanding of charge transport by ions. The conductivity of the electrolyte is measured for electrolyte solution with concentrations in the range of 10⁻³ to 10⁻¹ mol L⁻¹ as a solution in this range of concentrations can be easily prepared.

The molar conductivity (Λ_m) of strong electrolyte solutions can be nicely fit by Kohlrausch equation.

$$\Lambda_m = \Lambda^0{}_m - A \ c^{1/2}$$

Where Λ^0_m is the molar conductivity at infinite dilution and C is the concentration of the solution. The value of the constant 'A' for a given solvent and temperature depends on the type of electrolyte i.e., the charges on the cation and anion produced on the dissociation of the electrolyte in the solution.

The molar conductivity of weak electrolytes, on the other hand, is dependent on the degree of dissociation of the electrolyte. The molar conductivity at infinite dilution can be decomposed into the contributions of each ion.

$$\Lambda^0 m = V_+ \lambda^0_+ + V_- \lambda^0_-$$

Where, λ + and λ - are the ionic conductivities of positive and negative ions, respectively, and V+ and \mathbf{v} - are their stoichiometric coefficients in the salt molecular formula.


- (i) At higher altitudes, people suffer from a disease called anoxia.
