Explain what 'The poetry of earth is ceasing never' means. Why did Binya have to be careful about not starting a landslide? Ans: The things that we give in life eventually come back to us. If we are kind we would receive kindness, if we are rude, we would receive rudeness. The old lady was gray, weak and poor and helping her was an act of kindness. The boy in the poem has a mother too and he believes that if he is kind to the old lady, someone would eventually be kind to his mother as well. The poet sees 'the fog, grow thick' in front of his eyes. This 'soon made blind his ken', which means, making him almost blind, by affecting his senses. The fog 'made tall men of boys and giants of tall men' as it affected his vision. By the line that, 'The poetry of earth is ceasing never', the poet means that, the song of nature is never silent. When one of the insects gets tired and retires, the other is always there to take his place—the Grasshopper and the Cricket in this poem, respectively. Loose stones rumbled down the cliff.
