19 'James Mill thought that, all Asian societies were at a lower level of civilisation than Europe'. Explain the statement.

Answer:

- According to James Mill, before the British came to India, Hindu and Muslim despots ruled the country.
- Religious intolerance, caste taboos and superstitious practices dominated in their social life.
- For this, it was necessary to introduce European manners, arts, institutions and laws, etc in India.
- James Mill felt that only the British rule could civilise the Indians.
- He suggested that the British should conquer all the territories in India to ensure the enlightenment and happiness of the Indians. According to him, India cannot progress without the British help.
- •The British rule represented all the forces of progress and civilisation, period before the British rule was one of darkness.
- 20 What do official records do not tell? How do we come to know about them?

Answer:

- •Official records do not always help us understand about the lives of the people in the country and their contributions.
- To know more on the lives of the people, we have diaries of the people, accounts of the pilgrims and travelers, autobiographies of the important personalities, and popular booklets that were sold in the local bazaars.
- •As printing spread, newspapers were published and issues were debated in public.
- •Leaders and reformers who spread their ideas, poets and novelists wrote to express their feelings.
- But we will not be able to understand the lives of the tribes and the peasants, the workers in the mines or the poor on the streets. Getting information to know about their lives is a more difficult task.
