- 1 After a life-changing internship at the Make-A-Wish Foundation, Jessica Ekstrom decided she wanted to continue helping children with life-threatening illnesses by starting her own business. Her company, Headbands of Hope, sells made-in-the-U.S. headbands and donates a dollar of each sale to childhood cancer research through the St. Baldrick's Foundation. Identify the concept discussed above. (Social Responsibility)
- 2 Tata Motors' focus on environmental management helps preserve the long-term health of people and ecosystems and build strong relationships with local communities. Various initiatives have been undertaken within the broad frame of Environment and Climate Change to address the conservation of natural resources and energy, minimize waste generation, enhance recovery and recycling of material and develop eco-friendly process and systems. We have been continuously working towards reducing our various environmental footprints, which is evidenced by our decrease in specific consumption levels. We recycle close to 69% of wood packaging, eliminating the use of fresh wood. A 200 liter engine oil barrel can now be used to test 170 engines instead of 85 engines.

At Jamshedpur and Lucknow, the wet garbage from our canteens is converted to usable organic manure to sustain greenery in the plants. We achieved annualized energy savings of 230,959 GJ through conservation initiatives across our operations. Similarly, in last three years, we have reduced Green House Gas emissions by 22,581.62 tons of  $CO_2$  while total energy consumed per vehicle produced has also decreased.
