Democracy	Monarchy
❖ Democracy is a government of the people, by the people and for the people.	❖ In a monarchy, it is the King or queen who has the power to make decisions and run the government.
❖ In democracy, people are supreme because it is they who give the government power.	❖ In monarchy, a small group of people discuss the matters with the monarch. But the final decision-making power remains with the monarch
❖ The government has to explain its actions and defend their decisions before the people.	❖ Unlike democracy, The kings and queens do not have to explain their actions or defend their decisions before the people
