A **'Pronoun'** is a word which is used instead of a noun.

Pronouns can be singular or plural.

- 1. **Singular Pronouns** Talk about one person or thing.
- 2. **Plural Pronouns** Talk about more than one person or thing.

## **Singular Pronouns**



- 1.  $\mathbf{I}$  The pronoun  $\mathbf{I}$  is used to speak about oneself. [myself]
  - **E.g.** *I* love to write poems.
- 2. *He* The pronoun '*He'* is used to speak about one boy/man.
  - **Eg.** Henry has new crayons. [Henry] *He* loves them a lot.
- 3. She The pronoun 'She' is used to speak about one girl/woman.
  - **E.g.** Jessi is in the park. [Jessi] *She* is skipping.



**4. It**- The pronoun — '**It**' is used to speak about one thing/ place. E.g. My mother baked cake. [muffins] **It** is delicious.



**5. His** –The pronoun – '**His**' is used to speak about one' belonging/ possession of a boy/ man.

E.g. Tom has a bakery. [Tom] *His* cakes are the best.

6. **Her**—The pronoun — '**Her**' is used to speak about one's belonging/ possession of a girl/woman.

**E.g.** Lily is a dancer. [Lily] *Her* dance videos are amazing.



7. **Me** – The pronoun – '**me**' is used to speak about belonging/ possession of things that I have.

**E.g.** This doll belongs to *me?* 

8. **You** – The pronoun **'You'** is special because it can be singular or plural. The pronoun **'You'** is used to speak about another person/ thing.

When it talks about only one person /thing, it is a singular pronoun.

**E.g. You** are my friend.
