ADVERBS

An adverb is a word which modifies a verb, an adjective or another adverb.

For example

- Manish typed **quickly**.

The adverb quickly modifies the verb(typed).

- She cooked a **very** tasty meal.

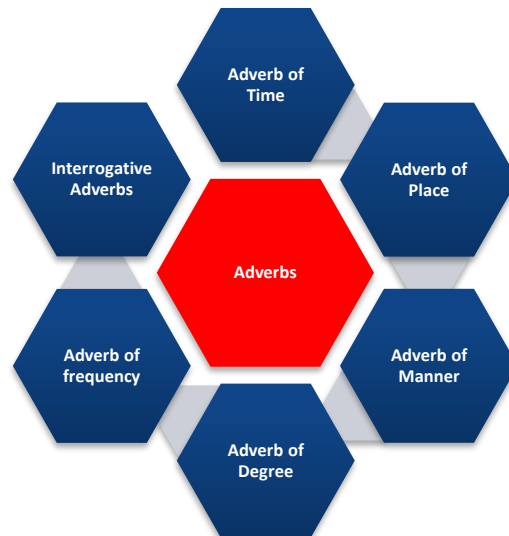
The adverb very qualifies the adjective(tasty).

- The man jumped over the fence **quite** carefully.

The adverb quite qualifies the adverb (carefully).



Kinds of adverbs:



Kind of adverb	Function	Examples	Example sentence
Adverb of Manner 	This shows how or in what manner an action takes place. It answers the question 'how'.	Carefully, slowly, loudly, clearly, fast, etc.	The lion roared loudly. We must not treat animals cruelly.
Adverb of Time 	This gives us information about when an action takes place. It answers the question 'when'.	still, yet, tomorrow, today, now, then, early, soon, etc.	It may rain soon. I reached school late.
Adverb of Place 	This gives us information about where an action occurs. It answers the question 'where'.	there, here, in, out, downstairs, upstairs, up, left, right, etc.	I am going out. I have misplaced my keys somewhere.
Adverb of Frequency 	This tells us how often or how many times an action takes place. It answers the question 'how often'.	Always, often, never, sometimes, frequently, once a week etc.	They are always on time. Jayesh seldom stays quiet.
Adverbs of Degree 	This expresses the strength or intensity of an action. It answers the questions 'How much?', 'How far?', and 'To what extent?'.	Very, almost, totally, enough, quite, nearly etc.	He is totally exhausted. The report is absolutely true.
Interrogative Adverb 	These adverbs ask questions.	When, where, how, why etc.	When did the match start? Where will we be going for the vacations?
