Conjunctions

Conjunction - A word that is used to join words, groups of words or sentences is called a Conjunction. They are also known as joining words or connecting words.

Some of the Conjunctions are:

- **so** – is used to show the result as in the sentence.

Eg. I will set my alarm clock, **so** I won't wake up late..

- **if** – is used to show the condition.

Eg. Wood doesn't burn **if** there is no air.

- **until** – is used to show up to, but not after, a specific time i.e., to say how long a situation continues.

Eg. We played **until** it got dark.
