

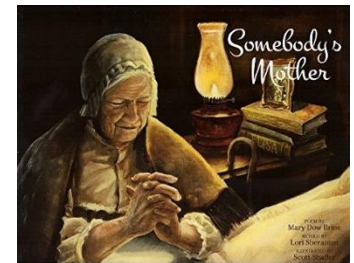

6. What did the old woman say in her prayers that night?



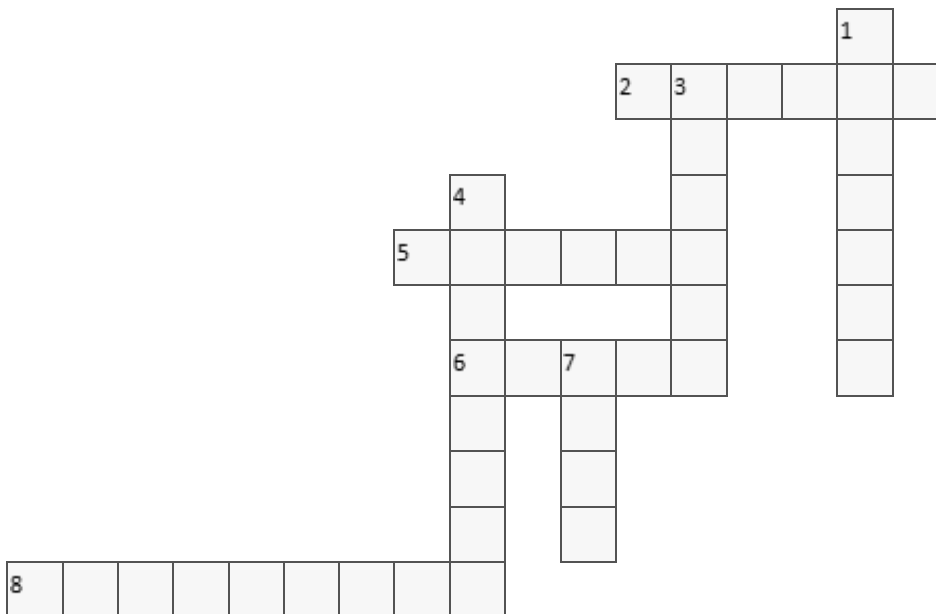
II. Answer these questions with reference to the context.
