A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun. They make sentences shorter and easier to say.


A **Possessive Pronoun** is a word that takes the place of names of someone or something that shows possession.

Possessive Pronouns do not come with an apostrophe.

PERSONAL PRONOUNS	POSSESSIVE PRONOUNS	
I have a bicycle.	The bicycle is mine .	
You have a bicycle.	The bicycle is yours.	
He has a bicycle.	The bicycle is his.	
She has a bicycle.	The bicycle is hers.	
It has a bicycle	X	
We have a bicycle.	The bicycle is ours.	
They have a bicycle.	The bicycle is theirs.	

Example:

It is her car. The car is hers.



It is my sandwich. The sandwich is **mine**.
