Pass-back Stories:

- 3. Each group will add content to the story and the students will end their story and give a suitable title to it & return the paper to the first group.

✓ Describing sensory experiences:

✓ Building to a reveal or twist:

- ''And then I realized...''
- "It wasn't just the darkness; there was something more..."
- "What I hadn't noticed before was now painfully clear..."
- "Just as I was about to turn and run, I heard it—a faint whisper."
- "The truth hit me like a bolt of lightning..."

- "Even the birds seemed to stop their songs..."




> Building the tension or conflict:
