1. They have already completed the assignment. (Present Perfect Tense)
2. It smells very delicious in the kitchen. (Simple Present Tense)
3. I am reading a very interesting historical account. (Present Continuous Tense)
4. We generally sing songs all together. (Simple Present Tense)
5. We go to a gallery every Sunday. (Simple Present Tense)
6. Does he write an email? (Simple Present Tense)
7. I have been writing letters since 10 o'clock today. (Present Perfect Continuous Tense)
8. The Earth moves around the Sun. (Simple Present Tense)
9. Just look at her, she is still sleeping. (Simple Present & present continuous Tense)
10. It doesn't rain here in summer. (Simple Present Tense)
11. We are having music lessons these days. (Present Continuous Tense)

Ex.II. Read through the narrative and fill in each blank with the correct form of the verb provided in parentheses.

1. **found** (*Simple Past*) — Refers to a completed action at a specific time in the past ("Yesterday").
2. **was turning** (*Past Continuous*) — Describes an action that was in progress when another event interrupted it.
3. **fell** (*Simple Past*) — The interrupting single action that happened in the past.
4. **had heard** (*Past Perfect*) — Refers to an action that occurred before another past event (hearing rumors happened before finding the journal).
5. **had ever seen** (*Past Perfect*) — Describes an ongoing situation prior to a past point in time.
6. **leads** (*Simple Present*) — Expresses a general fact or condition about what the map shows.
7. **is examining** (*Present Continuous*) — Indicates an action happening right now ("Currently").
8. **is watching** (*Present Continuous*) — Describes a secondary action happening simultaneously in the present.
9. **drew or has drawn** (*Simple Past / Present Perfect*) — Refers to a past action with present relevance (the mark is visible now).
10. **will set** (*Simple Future*) — Refers to a scheduled or intended action occurring in the future ("Tomorrow morning").

11. **will have uncovered** (*Future Perfect*) — Expresses an action that will be completed prior to a specific future time ("by tomorrow afternoon").
12. **will have already begun** (*Future Perfect*) — Indicates an event that will be finished before another future action occurs ("by the time their parents wake up").

1. Our Manager will be joining (join) us for lunch after the show is over. (Future Continuous Tense)
2. Anuj and Sheela were fighting (fight) about their possessions. (Past Continuous Tense)
