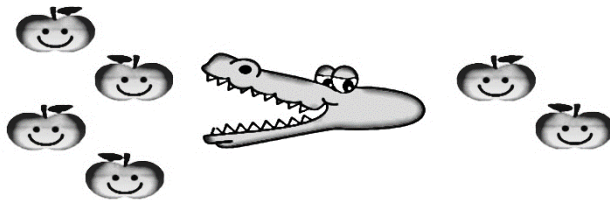

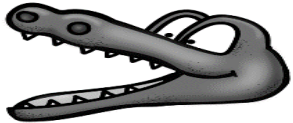
## Notes - Comparing Numbers



The mouth of the crocodile will always open to the bigger number.

There are three signs/symbols used to compare numbers.

1. Greater than  $>$



It is placed between two numbers in such a way that the open side is towards the bigger number.

Eg.  $7 > 2$

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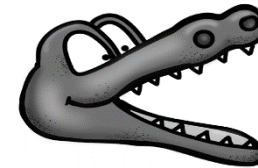
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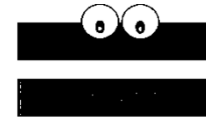
2. Smaller than /  $<$  Less than



The closed side is towards the smaller number.

Eg.  $4 < 8$

3. Equal to



It is placed between two numbers, when the numbers on both sides of the sign have the same number/value.

Eg.  $6 = 6$

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
