



Notes - Comparing Numbers



The mouth of the crocodile will always open to the bigger number.

There are <u>three signs/symbols</u> used to compare numbers.

1. Greater than



It is placed between two numbers in such a way that the open side is towards the bigger number.

Eg. 9 > 2

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
2. Smaller than / Less than



The closed side is towards the smaller number.

Eg. 4 < 7

3. Equal to



It is placed between two numbers, when the numbers on both sides of the sign have the same number/value.

Eg. 8 = 8

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
