> <u>Definition:</u>

- \checkmark The part of a sentence that performs the action is called the subject.
- ✓ The part of a sentence that is not the subject is called the predicate. It tells us more about the subject.

Points to remember:

- The subject does not always come at the beginning of a sentence.
 For example: Down rolled the stones.
- \checkmark Some sentences have more than one subject and predicate.
- ✓ To find the subject in a question or an exclamation, rewrite it. For example:
- Has Anna baked a cake? (question) In order to find the subject, you may write this sentence as:
- Anna has baked a cake. (statement) We can now easily see that the subject is Anna.
