**POSSESSIVE PRONOUN**

A Possessive Pronoun is a pronoun that is used to indicate possession or ownership.

Example,

This book is my book, not your book.

This book is **mine**, not **yours**.

NOTE:

- Possessive Pronouns never come before the noun.

<b>PERSONAL PRONOUN</b>	<b>POSSESSIVE PRONOUN</b>
<b>I</b> have a pen.	The pen is <b>mine</b> .
<b>You</b> have a pen.	The pen is <b>yours</b> .
<b>He</b> has a pen.	The pen is <b>his</b> .
<b>She</b> has a pen.	The pen is <b>hers</b> .
<b>We</b> have a pen.	The pen is <b>ours</b> .
<b>They</b> have a pen.	The pen is <b>theirs</b> .
<b>It</b> is a house.	The house lost <b>its</b> charm.

**POSSESSIVE PRONOUN**

<b>They</b> have a pen.	The pen is <b>theirs</b> .
