**Countable Nouns**

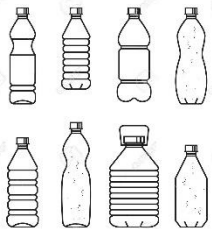
- ✓ They are nouns that **can be** counted.
- ✓ They have singular and plural forms.
- ✓ The articles '**a**' or '**an**' can be used for singular countable nouns.



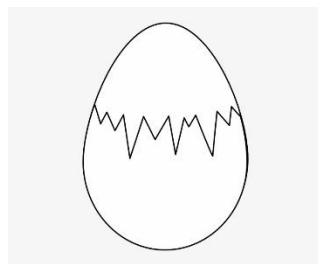
three candles



a cake



eight bottles



an egg

**Uncountable Nouns**

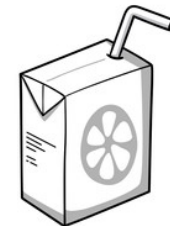
- ✓ They are nouns that **cannot be** counted.
- ✓ We **do not** use the article '**a**' or '**an**' with them.
- ✓ We use **quantifiers** like **some**, **little** or **much** before them.
- ✓ For example: a little salt, some juice, or much food.
- ✓ They do not have a plural form.



milk



honey



juice



salt

**Note:**

We can use **measure words** or **counters** to quantify Uncountable Nouns.

For example:

- **a glass** of water
- **a bowl** of soup
- **a pinch** of salt
- **a slice** of bread
